What are KS2 SATs?

- ·Standard Assessment Tests.
- ·All children have to be tested before they go to secondary school.
- ·Provides assessment information for secondary schools.
- •Purpose assign National Curriculum expectant scores to children before they leave primary school.

What level should Y6 children be at?

- ·As you all know by now, children are no longer levelled as 3,4,5 etc but instead are scored as either Achieved standard (AS)or not achieved standard (NS)
- This is a new government regulation that has been installed in all schools around Britain.

What information do secondary schools want?

SATs results

Teacher assessments

Tests administered by the high schools

You should've applied to a secondary school by now

What does teacher assessment involve, and is it different from testing?

•Teacher assessment draws together everything the teacher or teachers know about a child, including observations, marked work and school assessments.

•Teacher assessment is not a 'snapshot' like tests and is therefore more reliable.


 There can be a difference between teacher assessment results and test scores.

How is SATs week organised?

- · A timetable is issued to school, telling us on which days/sessions tests must be administered.
- ·All children must sit the tests at the same time.
- •Test papers can only be opened 1 hour before the tests begin.
- •Tests are completed in classrooms, with any displays that may help covered over.

LITERACY

English SATs consist of:

- A Reading test
- A Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling test (SPAG)



Reading



- Reading booklet contains a range of different types of texts.
- Answer booklet has a range of question types

 retrieval of information, sequencing events,
 explaining language choices, explaining text
 features, inference and deduction.
- The children have 60 minutes to read and complete questions.





There are 4 main types of questions on the reading paper:

- ·Literal answer is there in the text
- · Deductive look for clues
- ·Inferential read between the lines
- <u>Authorial intent</u> e.g. why an author may use a particular word



How can parents help with reading?



- · Ensure your child reads every night!
- Encourage them to read fiction and non-fiction.
- Try to ask them questions about the text.
- Help them with the different skills of reading especially 'skim' reading where they are looking for key words in the text.
- Speed reading

Spelling Punctuation and Grammar (SPaG)

- Spelling Test 20 sentences with a missing spelling - worth 20 marks. About 20min
- Grammar and Punctuation Test worth 50 marks. A 45min test
- The two marks are combined to give an overall SPaG level.

How can parents help with writing?



- Again, reading a variety of texts the more children read, the more familiar they become with different text types
- ·Spelling homework
- •Encouraging your child to complete all homework and discussing their work with them.
- •When helping your child with their homework please encourage them to think for themselves rather than giving them the answers or explaining immediately how to answer the question.



MATHEMATICS



- •Mathematics SATs consist of:
- Paper 1: Arithmetic (40 marks)

30 minute test, no calculators allowed

Paper 2: Reasoning (35 marks)

40 minute test, no calculators allowed

Paper 3: Reasoning (35 marks)

40 minute test, no calculators allowed





- •Some questions are worth one mark and therefore accuracy is important.
- •Other questions are worth two marks and even if the answer is wrong, a mark may be given for correct working out.
- Teachers may read questions in all written papers to pupils if asked.



How can parents help with Maths?



 Support with homework - not just helping with the Maths but reading the question can really help.

·Help your child to check their work through - this will help them to spot mistakes that can sometimes be easily fixed.

- Science is teacher assessed at KS2
- A few children from the school (chosen at random) may be assessed, however, these reports will only be used to produce National data.


