Parents gave many suggestions on improving all parts of the school and everything has been taken into account and considered. Unfortunately it is not possible to increase the sizes of the classrooms and playground, as the building is small itself which allows us to ensure small class numbers, focusing on the quality of care and education to our students.

Parents' tea party: Thank you again to those who participated in the tea party. It was an excellent time for us to discuss different factors about the school and a way of getting to know one other.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Please remember to drop your child/children at 8am for assembly. Registration starts at 8:15 am and finishes at 8:20am. Any child comes after registration time will be marked as late. Those who are persistently late dropping their children off to school and picking them up late (after 4pm) will be fined £20 if this continues for five days in a month.

Consequences of Persistent Unauthorised Absences:

If a child is persistently absent without authorisation (3days in a month) parents must meet with the Head teacher and also will be fined £50. The Local Authority may be involved and this could result in dismissal from the school.

Health week:

We will be having a healthy week for the whole school, starting from Tuesday 21st February and continuing until Friday 24th February. The parents are requested to send **ONLY** healthy foods for their children's snacks and lunch. Thursday 23rd February will be an 'Al-Falah Health Awareness Day' where the children will be participating in different activities throughout the afternoon sessions. We anticipate that this will allow children to gain a good understanding of how to keep themselves healthy.

International Language day:

International Mother Language Day (IMLD) is a worldwide annual observance held on 21 February to promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity and multilingualism. First

announced by UNESCO on 17 November 1999, it was formally recognized by the United Nations General Assembly in 2008. If parents can help their children to write 3-5 sentences in their mother tongue i.e. My name is my mother tongue is I can speak Arabic/Somali/Urdu/Bengali and so on. They can bring their writing in school where we will have a special assembly to give them a chance to showcase and display their work.

Teacher Messages:

Ms Noureen Y1: Year one have worked hard on recounts and story writing this term. Children re-enacted the story of the gingerbread man as well as identified the beginning, middle and the end part of the story. In PSHE children explored the local community and identified all the people who help us. Children designed their own police badge and they became familiar with the job role of a fire-fighter. Islamic Studies:

All praises to the We all had a wonderful half term despite the cold winter weather. Imam Ahmad relates from the narration of Abu Sa'id al-Khudri (r), that the Prophet (pbuh) said, "Winter is the springtime of the believer." This is because it is a time he grazes in the orchids of obedience, frolics in the fields of worship and frees his heart in the gardens of righteous deeds that are made easy at that time. This Hadith is recorded by Imam al-Bayhaqi and others. Imam Bayhaqi has another version that states, "Its nights are long so he spends them in worship, and its days are short so he fasts them."

This term we have focused on the value of 'Respect' through our 'Hadith a week program'. We are especially encouraging children to focus on displaying respect towards one another, irrespective of our differences. I believe that this is truly pertinent at the current times. Year Six: This term were focusing on 'the constitution of Madeenah'.
